Visit to Ellisland Farm




I had the incredible opportunity, along with my staff, to visit Robert Burns Ellisland Museum and Farm in Dumfries, the home of Scotland's national poet, Robert Burns. This remarkable place is where Burns lived and worked from 1788 to 1791. It was here that he penned some of his greatest works, including the famous narrative poem Tam O'Shanter and the world famous song Auld Lang Syne. Standing in the very room where he wrote and gazing out the same windows he once looked through, you can't help but feel the spirit of his genius and connection to the land. The tranquil surroundings along the banks of the River Nith played a significant role in shaping his thoughts and creative expressions. Burns found peace here, balancing the life of a farmer with that of a poet and exciseman. For anyone who loves Burns' work, Ellisland is a must-visit—an authentic glimpse into the life of the man behind the words. A huge thank you to Joan McAlpine and Adam Dickson for taking the time to show us around this beautiful piece of Scottish history.

My staff attended an important event, hosted by GamCare Scotland and ALERTS, as part of the National Gambling Support Network. The round table discussion focused on the growing concern of gambling harms in Scotland and their devastating impact on our communities. Experts, advocates, and individuals with lived experience came together to explore how gambling affects mental health, family life, and society as a whole. Several individuals and organisations took to the floor to highlight the challenges they face, including former footballer John Hartson, who spoke powerfully about the heartbreaking decisions and struggles he experienced during his battle with gambling addiction. Harrowingly, it was highlighted that research shows around one person a day dies by suicide due to gambling-related issues in the UK. If you or someone you know is struggling with gambling addiction, Gamblers Anonymous offers confidential support through group meetings and a safe space for those battling addiction. Help is available—don't hesitate to reach out. Together, we must continue to raise awareness and drive meaningful change to support those affected by gambling harms.
