Special thoughts were with our dear friend and colleague, Christina McKelvie, whose strength continues to inspire us all.




International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) and BSI UK

Portfolio Question Time

I asked whether the minister agrees that the UK Government should negotiate a new deal with the EU that aligns with the wishes of the Scottish people, especially in light of concerns raised by the Association of Independent Meat Suppliers about veterinary oversight and certification processes.

I asked the Scottish Government whether it will provide an update on what assessment it has made of the impact of Brexit on Scotland's food and drink sector.

I sought clarification from the minister on the implementation of the minimum unit price increase and how it is expected to help reduce alcohol-related harm.

Challenge Poverty Week Debate

8 October 2024

During Challenge Poverty Week, I expressed my disappointment that my previous concerns about social poverty remain unaddressed due to the lack of action from the new UK Government. I highlighted that in 2019, over 6,500 families across Lanarkshire's seven Westminster constituencies were impacted by the two-child limit, affecting more than 22,300 children. In some constituencies, 16% of children are living in poverty.

I asked whether the cabinet secretary agrees that Scotland's strong performance in attracting foreign direct investment, despite the challenges posed by Brexit and its limited diplomatic representations, reflects good value for money.

I sought the Scottish Government's view on how the new UK law mandating employers to pass all tips to workers may impact Scotland's fair work agenda and night-time economy.

Economic Growth Debate

30 October 2024

During the Economic Growth Debate, I raised my concern about the damage done to Scottish businesses at the expense of the UK-EU trade and co-operation agreement. Despite challenges, GDP in Scotland has continued to grow, outpacing the rest of the UK. Scotland has led UK growth, achieving record foreign investment in 2023 and five years of consecutive growth—the highest in a decade. I highlighted how Brexit has hindered worker recruitment and has limited Scotland's growth potential by ending EU free movement, reducing workforce availability.
